
On behalf of Balally Players I would like to welcome you to the Mill Theatre for this production of "Out of Order" by Ray Cooney.



In real life these predicaments would typically have severe consequences. But Cooney operates in neither the world of tragedy nor the world of drama, his plays are farces in the purest sense of the word.


So we invite you to sit back, relax and get ready to laugh yourself silly as we engage in the zany world of political intrigue that is "Out of OrderMinister"
