Director's Note



Arguably Shakespeare's most famous play begins with a Prologue which establishes that this play will be a tragedy and that the children of two feuding families, Romeo of the Montague family and Juliet of the Capulet family, will both love and die in the course of the action. The play is set in Verona, Italy, where an old feud between the families of the Montagues and the Capulets breaks out into a civil war.

The hatred between these two extended families is intense and uncompromising. Young Romeo Montague goes out with his friends to make trouble at a party the Capulets are hosting, but while there he spies the Capulet's daughter Juliet, and falls hopelessly in love with her. She returns his affections, but they both know that their families will never allow them to meet.

The lovers find ways to get together and marry secretly, but Romeo is forced to kill one of her cousins and is banished. The story ends in double tragedy as the two loving youths commit suicide in the belief their feuding families will never accept their love.

As always, Shakespeare was conscious of his public and being the consummate playwright, interlaced comedy and heartbreak, music and dance in this classic tale of romance and tragedy.

We would particularly like to mention Dympna who designed and made the costumes you see here tonight, Paul who choreographed the fight scenes and Emma for her work on the dances. A collaborative process, this was a happy company undertaking and although many hours in rehearsal, we enjoyed the process. We hope you enjoy the evening.


Robert Hudson - Romeo, son of the Montagues

Roles include Don in Boys' Life by Howard Korder with the Attic Studio, directed by Graham Cantwell, Oscar shortlist best director for short film 2006. Other roles include Bassanio in The Merchant of Venice with Dublin Shakespeare. Robert also reached the final 50 from 2,700 applicants for RADA in London.



Eilis O' Brien - Juliet, Daughter of the Capulets

Eilis is the winner of the Shakespeare Cup, the premier award in Speech & Drama, and a Gold Medal winner at Feis Maitiu. She makes her stage debut with the company, playing the role of Juliet.





Michael makes his first appearance with the company having played in drama, variety and pantomime with various Dublin groups. Dramatic roles have included Birdboot in The Real Inspector Hound, Eilert Lovborg in Hedda Gabler, Mitch in A Streetcar named Desire, The Old Man in Fool for Love and Théramène in Phèdre.



Gareth Murphy - Mercutio, Kinsman of Escalus, friend of Romeo

Gareth is featuring in his second production back on home soil having wowed audiences in New York City playing Jack Worthing in an off-off-Broadway production of Oscar Wilde's The Importance of Being Earnest. In 2006, she was awarded Best Actress in the first of our All Ireland winning productions Melody by Deirdre Kinahan and she appeared in the second All Ireland winning play - Synge's Riders to the Sea. Her most recent appearance has been as Barbara in Happy Birthday Dear Alice at The Mill Theatre.



Mark Phelan - Tybalt, Cousin of Juliet, nephew of Lady Capulet

Mark is relatively new to the acting scene but in his short time he has been incredibly active. He recently appeared in a short movie The Purest Flower of Valdarill as Hessiodos, a wine-addled forest dweller and he is also involved with Rubberhead Productions - a small production company that deals with short movies/music videos.



Brendan Dunne - Capulet, patriarch of the House of Capulet

Brendan has appeared as Liam in Conversations on a Homecoming, Claudius in Hamlet, De Reca in Virtual Reality. He is a multi award winning actor on the circuit and made his debut for the company in 2004 with Much Ado about Nothing. More recently Brendan starred in the company's production of The Plough and the Stars.
